1 Overview

The course aims to introduce students to the basic ideas and principles of syntactic analysis and sentence structure, as well as to the syntax-related terminology. We will discuss the notion of syntax and syntactic rules, talk about the major principles behind dividing sentences into smaller parts, and get familiar with syntactic hierarchies. We will also talk about the history of syntactic studies, syntax in language acquisition and language learning, and Universal Grammar (if you don't know what that is – join the course!)

As this is the first part of the three-part syntax program (Foundations, Syntax and Advanced Syntax), the students are expected not to have any prior knowledge on the subject.
