	Extended exponence of the Perfect: (a) vowel change (b) affix			

E': could be **child** /tʃaɪld/ – **child** /tʃɪld/ ← Plural by vowel change only, cf. **man–men; goose–geese** etc.

E **child** /tʃaɪld/ – **children** /tʃɪld-r-ən/ ← Pluralization by vowel change PLUS /r/ PLUS /ən/, cf. **ox-en** /ɒksən/

E': could be **drive** /draɪv/ – **drove** /drɒv/ – **driv** /drɪv/ (cf. **sing, sang, sung**)

* Cf. non-standard English **bring, brung, brung**
